Curriculum Intent: Our curriculum is for pupils who want to acquire subject specific knowledge through planning, developing and adapting opportunities for children across the five areas of development and will broaden learners experience and understanding of progression into a variety of occupations both within childcare and outside of teaching.

Curiculum Rationale: The logically organised curriculum is taught in a sequential order, presenting a clear narrative over time that builds on knowledge, which aims to provide pupils with transferable key skills and is part of an integrated whole rather than distinct study areas.
