

Music Curriculum Overview

Curriculum Intent: The focus of the Music curriculum here at Wednesfield Academy is to enable pupils to develop their creativity, confidence, and communication through performing, evaluating, and composing. We want our pupils to be inducted into the powerful cultural knowledge associated with music and discover and develop their performing skills to a level of proficiency that enables them to participate in social music making activities. The teaching staff supports pupil's creative intentions and offer opportunities for pupils to showcase their work.

Curriculum Rationale: Pupils will be taught the basic skills which allows them to develop and grow throughout Key Stage 3. They will explore a variety of genres, instruments, and techniques through composing, evaluating, and performing. Pupils will look at the impact music has had historically and will investigate key techniques and elements within these styles. Pupils will develop their social and soft skills through their music journey which will allow them to have the skills to be a successful young person and have an appreciation of music.
