Dear Parent/Carer

We hope you all had a great festive break, and Happy New Year! We had some exciting news this week, as one of our Year 13 pupils was offered a place at Oxford University. This is the first time this has happened at Wednesfield Academy in the past 20 years and as a school we are immensely proud of them. It is an exciting time for the Sixth Form, as other pupils have been offered places at Birmingham, Nottingham and other excellent universities.

This letter has some key information for parents, and the latter part is relevant to Year 11 and 13 pupils only.

# **Careers Provision Development**

Within school we are working hard with several external providers to ensure that all pupils have access to the best careers programme possible. As you will have seen from last term's newsletters, pupils in several year groups have already had opportunities to work with Warwick University, Aston University and Aberystwyth University as well as over 20 providers who attended our Pathways Event in November 2023.

This term that provision will continue to grow with labour market information assemblies in February, a whole school careers event in March, the opportunity for Year 8 to attend Worcester University, Year 12 to complete work experience and Year 9 pupils to take part in our Take Your Child to Work initiative in the summer term.

We understand the value of maintaining links with our Alumni, as well as utilising the experiences of our parents in supporting the careers programme in school. ## Homework: ClassCharts

As a school we value meaningful homework and understand the positive impact that homework can have on your child's progress.

From Monday 29<sup>th</sup> January 2024 all homework tasks will be set on ClassCharts which will mean that as parents you will be able to view all homework set each week on the app, in addition to checking that your child has recorded this in their planner.

We hope that this will support you to continue to work with us to encourage your child to complete the tasks set and to help develop their independence.

## **Behaviour**

Behaviour across the school has improved and there is much more focus in lessons, but there is still work to do. The number of suspensions has reduced, which is a result of improved school systems and the excellent support from many parents in addressing any behaviour concerns. An important part of ensuring this continues to improve are the reintegration meetings if your child is suspended.

This allows the school and parents to discuss appropriate support for individual pupils and address the reasons for the suspension. These meetings are arranged with parents and aim to offer a united approach to support pupils.

Unfortunately, a small minority of parents still do not attend these meetings meaning that we are unable to form strong partnerships between home and school in these cases. It is then not surprising that although behaviour in school is improving, there is a direct correlation between repeat suspensions and the pupils whose parents do not attend the reintegration meeting.

## Wednesfield Friends

The 'Wednesfield Friends' which is our parent and staff partnership group have been busy so far this academic year. In December 2023, the 'Wednesfield Friends' organised our Festive Market. We are pleased to announce that we raised £1,000 from this event. We have now donated money back into school and supported the PE department in funding new improved equipment. The group looks forward to providing further support to the performing arts department for this year's school show and the library for some of our pupils' favourite book collections.

Our next event is bingo which will be held on Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> February 2024 and please check our school's social media page for more information. This is an adult only event, and we would like to see as many parents there as possible.

## School Intervention Police Officer (SIPO)

We are now fortunate to have a weekly visit from our SIPO. The SIPO is working with some of our pupils on a one-to-one basis and we are keen to promote this with parents. #### Attendance and Punctuality

Thank you to parents and carers who contact the House Office each morning when there is an absence and provide evidence for medical appointments. Last term, the school's attendance continued to increase.

We work very closely with the Local Authority and meet weekly with the Education Welfare Officer to discuss pupil attendance and punctuality. This week, we have been informed by the Local Authority that one set of parents at Wednesfield Academy, who were given a court date last half term, have now received their fine of over £450.

This is something we want to avoid, although it will happen when pupils are severely absent and there is no justification. However, as we have informed you in previous letters, parents are legally responsible for sending their child to school every day and it is a drain on resources when a child is severely absent without a valid reason. These resources would be used for investing further in the education of our pupils. Can I also take this opportunity to remind you that if a pupil is late after 9.00am, this affects their attendance, which can initiate action from the Local Authority. Pupils must be in school by 8:30am.
