MathsWatch is an online platform designed to enhance pupils' mathematical skills through a combination of video lessons, interactive practice questions, and assessments. It provides an invaluable opportunity for pupils to consolidate their learning, practice problem-solving, and reinforce key concepts outside of the classroom.

What is MathsWatch?

MathsWatch offers engaging video tutorials that break down complex mathematical topics into easy-to-follow steps, which pupils can watch at their own pace. After watching the videos, students complete practice exercises, which are automatically marked, providing immediate feedback and allowing them to track their progress.

How can you support your child with MathsWatch?
