This letter provides some important information from the local Police and updates from Wednesfield Academy.

As outlined in previous correspondence, this Thursday 5th December 2024 is a GCSE and A-Level Moderation Day, which means that all pupils will finish school at 12.40 pm on this date. We are also excited to invite you to our Christmas Fair on Thursday 5th December 2024 from 5:00 to 8:00 pm and hope to see as many of the local community there as possible.

Update from the Local Police

We have recently received valuable information from our local Police regarding the ongoing efforts to tackle knife crime and ensure the safety of young people in our community. The Police emphasise the importance of awareness and early intervention to prevent knife-related incidents. They urge parents to have open conversations with their children about the dangers of carrying or being involved with knives, highlighting the serious legal and personal consequences.

Additionally, they encourage families to be vigilant about potential warning signs, such as changes in behaviour or unexplained possessions. Schools, community groups, and law enforcement are working together to provide education and support, aiming to create a safe and positive environment for all young people.

How to have THAT conversation with your child:

- 1. Find a quiet and comfortable time to chat.
- 2. They might be reluctant to talk to you. So open use a recent news event as a conversation starter.
- 3. Discuss knives and how you both feel about them being used you are there to listen and support them.
- 4. Tell them even when they feel they do not have choices, they do.
- 5. Explain that knives do not give protection. Carrying one could be a prison sentence or getting hurt yourself.
- 6. Say the bravest thing to do is walk away from a dangerous situation.
- 7. Explore excuses for your child to walk away. They might have to pick up their little brother, or arrange for you to call them if they send you a message.
- 8. Reassure them that most people do not carry knives.

School Uniform
