Parents Said	We Did
Parents would like clearer expectations around the quality of homework pupils are completing and expressed a preference for using online platforms to support this.	We have invested in GCSEPod for Key Stage 3 to strengthen the quality, consistency, and accessibility of homework. This will support pupils' independent learning and give parents clearer insight into what is being set. We will review its impact together at the next Parent Forum.
You recognised the difficulties schools face with external support services being stretched but encouraged us to continue strengthening the wellbeing help available in school.	Your feedback reaffirmed our commitment to enhancing our internal support structures. We are continuing to develop our wellbeing provision and will keep parents updated as this grows.
Older pupils should be given first choice for Discovery Week trips, as they have fewer remaining opportunities before they leave school.	This change has now been implemented. Year 10 pupils will have priority, followed by Year 9, then Year 8, and finally Year 7. This has been communicated with parents and will be the approach going forward.
Pupils who are not eligible for a trip should not attend assemblies that promote it, where possible.	We have revised our approach. This year, information about the Turing Scheme trip will <i>not</i> be delivered in whole-cohort assemblies. Instead, we will use more targeted communication methods to ensure messages are shared appropriately and sensitively.
