



Geography Curriculum Overview

Curriculum intent:

Our geography curriculum builds pupils who are curious, globally aware and resilient by enabling them to explore the relationships between people and places across a range of scales. We aim for students to develop a deep understanding of both human and physical processes, from local environments to global issues such as development, climate change and natural hazards. Through studying a variety of regions including Africa, Asia, Russia and the Middle East, alongside UK landscapes and fieldwork investigation, pupils develop a sense of place, identity and responsibility towards the world around them. We want our students to leave with strong geographical knowledge, practical fieldwork skills and a lifelong curiosity about the changing world they live in.

Curriculum rationale: The logically sequenced geography curriculum is taught in a coherent and progressive order, building a clear understanding of place, processes and environments over time. It aims to develop students' transferable geographical skills and knowledge, enabling them to confidently apply their understanding to real-world contexts both in further education and beyond school.
